At the Friday closing service of GA24, General Overseer Gary Lewis and the Executive Committee brought the message, "We Are the Church of God."

Two years ago, I received the honor of a lifetime in being elected your general overseer. Together, we have been on an amazing journey in pursuit of the harvest. Our time in Indianapolis concluded with a dynamic outpouring of the Spirit, where hundreds experienced the Baptism of the Holy Ghost. That moment of refreshing was evidence that God was

Record Your Story: “We Remember... We Tell”

The Church of God Heritage Exhibit has an exciting feature at this General Assembly. Along with exploring the story of our musical heritage, the exhibit offers General Assembly delegates the opportunity to contribute to the preservation of our Church of God heritage.

The purpose of the “We Remember...We Tell” project is to pass on the testimonies of what God has done recently and is doing today. Those choosing to participate are invited to record their personal memories of a significant spiritual experience, miracle, revival, pastor, evangelist, or Christian mentor, or can reflect on some aspect of the “good old days.”

“The Holy Spirit has not stopped working in the Church of God,” noted

Church of God Historian David G. Roebuck. “We are thankful for the Biblical record of God’s work in the New Testament and for history books that chronicle the sacrificial stories of Church of God pioneers, but God is still working! We want to preserve what He is doing, so that we can tell these stories to our children and grandchildren.”

Assembly delegates are encouraged to come by the Heritage Exhibit and share their stories. Alternatively, a QR

code is available to record personal stories and experiences at another time and upload the audio or video recording to the Dixon Pentecostal Research Center. These recordings will be preserved and made available at the Church of God archives in Cleveland, Tennessee.

Roebuck encourages delegates, “Come make your story and the stories of significant people in your life a part of Church of God history.” ♦

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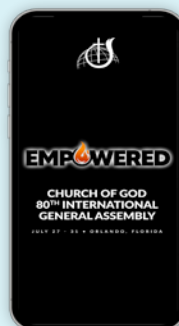

General Information About GA26

Assembly Delegates—According to the International General Assembly *Minutes*, “Members and ministers of the Church of God (16 years of age and above) present and registered at the International General Assembly shall comprise the voting constituency.” Registered delegates receive a manual and a badge that must be displayed in order to vote in International General Assembly business sessions. Entrances to the business sessions and worship will be at Halls A and B of the Orange County Convention Center (OCCC).

Business Office—The business office is located in Room WB-1 (third level) of the OCCC. Hours of operation are:

Children’s/Kid’s Church—Children ages 3 (if toilet trained) through 6 are invited to attend Children’s Church, located in room 206ABC of the OCCC, while ages 7–12 may participate in Kid’s Church located in 205ABC. Sessions will include Bible stories, puppets, music, and involvement activities. The schedule will be nightly Tuesday–Friday from 6:30 p.m. – 9:30 p.m. Children’s/Kid’s Church is provided at no cost; however, registration is required.

Credentials—All ordained bishops are required to register to be eligible to vote in International General Council sessions. Questions regarding ministerial status or licensure should be directed to the Registration/Credential Committee in the registration area located at the main entrance of the OCCC.

Deaf and Hard of Hearing—Reserved seating for those desiring assistance will be available on the main floor at the front of the Main Hall, stage right (as facing the stage). Signing will be provided.

Dining—The OCCC offers several dining options, as well as in the Exhibit Hall (please see page 16 for locations).

Exhibit Hall—Exhibits and displays are located in Hall B of the OCCC. There will be a wide variety of resources, ministries, and materials to assist churches and individuals. Exhibit Hall hours of operation are as follows:

First Aid/Health Care—On-site medical services are located in front of Hall C.

General Assembly TODAY/NewsMedia—Complimentary copies of *General Assembly TODAY* will be available Tuesday through Friday at tables near the entrances of the convention and exhibit halls. Digital copies are available at churchofgod.org/gatoday or by scanning the QR code. Media personnel who need assistance may visit the News and Publications area, located near the Main Hall entrance.

Mobility Options—Motorized seated scooters are available for rental from buenavistascooters.com. Please visit this website to secure a rental unit. The scooter will be delivered to your hotel.

Physically-Challenged Seating—Seating for the physically challenged is available on the main floor of the general session area. The OCCC is in compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and is designed with wheelchair ramps, automatic doors, passenger elevators and handicap-accessible restroom facilities.

Prayer Ministries—Monday through Friday, opportunities for intercessory prayer will be held in Room 202 in the OCCC. There will also be *Priority Prayer* with the General Council from 8:00 – 8:30 a.m. Tuesday through Friday in Business/Worship Hall.

Registration—The registration area is located in the main lobby of the OCCC near the entrances to the business and worship venue (Halls AB). A registration badge is required for admission to the International General Council and International General Assembly business sessions. All delegate credentials must be secured from the registration area.

Translation of Sessions—Translation services will be provided through a UHF translation device. Languages expected to be available include Spanish, French, Portuguese, and German. Delegates needing translation assistance may visit the General Assembly Translation Help Desk, located in the registration area.

Wall of Remembrance—A memorial is dedicated to the ministers who have passed away between June 1, 2024 and May 15, 2026. The Wall of Remembrance is located in the Exhibit Hall and open during exhibit hours.

Wellness Room—A designated area to provide privacy for nursing mothers is located on level 2, Hall C lobby, to the right of Citrus Cafe. ♦

Instructions to Delegates

1. Parliamentary Authority

- a. The International General Assembly has adopted *Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised*, as its parliamentary authority. The latest version is the 12th edition, published in 2020. This is the edition that will be used in the International General Council and International General Assembly business sessions.
- b. The International General Assembly has also adopted some self-imposed rules for the manner in which business can be conducted in the International General Council and International General Assembly business sessions. We cannot violate our own Bylaws. Any motion to suspend the rules and introduce business prior to the completion of the work of the agenda is not allowable because it would impinge upon the Bylaws and would amount to an attempt to suspend the Bylaws, which is never allowable. (Bylaws may be amended, but only under circumstances of previous notice.)
- c. All business will be conducted in an orderly fashion.

2. Seating of Delegates

- a. Only registered ordained bishops are to be seated in the sections identified for ordained bishops. Credentials must be openly displayed at all times.
- b. Ordained ministers, exhorters, and laypersons can be seated in any area beyond those designated for the International General Council.
- c. These business sessions are being video streamed live, with delay, on the Internet. All cell phones, tablets, and any other electronic communication devices should be silenced during the business sessions. **Audio or video recording of the business sessions is not allowed.**
- d. All delegates must be registered and displaying credentials to attend business sessions. This includes ordained ministers, exhorters, and laypersons. The registration area is located in the main lobby of the Orange County Convention Center, West Concourse.
- e. No ordained bishop will be allowed to vote unless his credentials are displayed and he is seated in the designated seating area. If credentials are lost, new ones can be secured from the Registration and Credentials Committee in the registration area.

- f. Each member of the *International General Council* should have received the International General Council Manual at registration. This manual contains pertinent materials for International General Council meetings and should be brought to all business sessions. The agenda is also available electronically at www.ga26.org.
- g. According to the current International General Assembly Bylaws, page 64 S2: Bylaws of the Church of God Article VI. Governing Bodies I. General Assembly Members: "*The International General Assembly is composed of all members and ministers of the Church of God 16 years of age and above. Members and ministers of the Church of God **present and registered** at the International General Assembly shall comprise its voting constituency.*"

3. Instructions concerning deportment during business meeting.

- a. Regular attendance at all International General Council sessions and the International General Assembly business session is strongly encouraged. The schedule is printed in the manual, in this edition of *GA Today*, on the backside of the ordained bishop's badge, as well as at www.ga26.org.
- b. There is to be no entering or exiting during voting. The Sergeants-at-Arms have been directed to control the entrances, so no one will be permitted to enter or exit during a vote.
- c. The moderator will not entertain any questions from the floor when a vote is being taken. If there is a problem that needs to be addressed, please inform a member of the Sergeants-at-Arms Committee.

4. Use of the Motion Submission Form (Applicable to registered members of the General Council only)

The Motion /Amendment Submission Form is provided in the back of the International General Council manuals and should be used to document in writing extended motions or amendments pertaining to the printed agenda. Please have the form completed prior to making your motion/amendment, so as to not delay business if called for by the moderator. Motions/amendments of extensive length or complexity may be emailed to gamotions@churchofgod.org. (Only motions / amendments pertaining to the printed agenda are to be submitted to this email. Non-agenda item motions should be submitted in writing at the Motions Committee kiosk.)

5. Limitation of Speeches

- a. A recording secretary will tabulate the number of speeches made by individuals.
- b. A member can speak no longer than ten minutes unless he obtains consent of the Assembly. (Robert's Rules, pg. 39). Such permission can be given by unanimous consent, or by means of a motion to Extend the Limits of Debate, which requires a two-thirds vote without debate (*Robert's Rules*, pgs. 179–187). Denise Watkins will serve as the official timekeeper and the Secretary General will state "Time" when the time limit has expired.
- c. A member is not to speak the second time on the same question in the same day as long as someone else desires the floor. Because the moderator cannot always know just how many times one speaks, he will depend upon the recording secretary to keep him informed.

6. Agenda

- a. The printed *agenda* that was made available at least thirty days prior to the opening of the International General Council is the "official agenda which is to claim the attention of the International General Council." (*Minutes* page 67, S4. III International General Council Agenda). There is no need for a motion to adopt/receive the agenda, since it is by our rules of procedure already adopted. The agenda is also available electronically at GA26.org.
- b. The *Bylaws* require that "Any new business shall be presented to the chairman of the Motions Committee, which committee shall receive, classify, clarify, eliminate duplication, and dispatch for placement on the agenda following the completion of the printed agenda." (*Minutes* Page 62, S2. Bylaws, Article VI, 2. International General Council, Agenda, Paragraph 4).

Note: Any new business for the 2026 International General Council shall be presented in a legible format (print or digital) not later than 2:00 p.m. on the second day of the International General Council (78th A., 2022).

- c. Please note in your *Agenda* that material from the current *Minutes* is on the left side (even-numbered) pages and new motions are on the right side (odd-numbered) pages.

7. Role of the Parliamentarians

The role of the parliamentarians is to advise the chair or individual members of the body. The parliamentarian does not rule on any issue. Only the chair is authorized to rule.

9. Electronic Voting Instructions

(General Council only)

- Voting for all positions will be by a wireless keypad. Members will not be sharing a keypad. Keypads will be available following the call-to-order by the moderator. All keypads will be sanitized once they are returned.

- Prior to each session all ministers must validate themselves. At the instruction of the moderator, key in your five-digit personal ministerial file number, verify its accuracy. If inaccurate, press the delete key and reenter. If accurate, press the SEND key. Keypad will display "sending" and "received." If you wish to abstain, simply do not vote. There will be no need to revalidate your number in the same session.

- If your keypad is not working properly, return it to the kiosk for replacement or raise your hand and a member of the Teller Committee will assist you.

- Keypads are not to be taken from voting floor, even if just for a brief time.

- Ordained bishops should prepare the voting worksheet for the Council of Eighteen in advance to help expedite the voting process.

- The following situations will be counted as invalid votes:

- If a minister votes for an ineligible member.
- If a minister enters an invalid ministerial file number.
- When voting, a vote for self or any member more than once on the same ballot will be invalid. Only the first vote will be valid. A member can choose to vote for a partial number of 18 (e.g., 6 of 18) the remaining non-votes are ignored and not counted as invalid.

- In order for any minister to be considered eligible for election or appointment by the International Executive Committee, International General Council, or International General Assembly, the minister must be current on both personal ministerial reports and the local church reports with required finances from the church he/she pastors (if applicable). (GA2018 Minutes; Page 110, S29, Instructions for Ministers, I. General Instructions for Ministers, Item 9.) ♦

INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE SPEAKER RECOGNITION SYSTEM



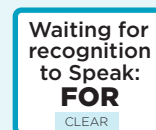
Template 1

- Each speaker stand is equipped with an electronic touch screen. This screen gives an individual four options:

- **Speak FOR** a motion
- **Speak AGAINST** a motion
- **Ask a QUESTION**
- **OTHER**

- When one of these options is pressed, the light turns on, a signal is sent to the podium indicating you wish to speak and your place in the speaking order is set automatically.

- Depending upon the option selected, you will see one of the following screens:



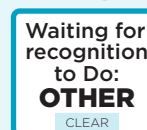

- If you no longer wish to speak, you can simply touch the **CLEAR** option and the light will be turned off and your position in the speaking order will be canceled.

- After speaking, the light will automatically be turned off, and the screen will reset for the next speaker.

STEP 1: INDICATE YOUR OPTION

(See Template 1)

- If you desire to speak, approach a speaker stand where the light is off.
- Touch the desired option on the screen.
- The light will come on and the screen will indicate you are waiting to be recognized according to your choice.
- Wait to be recognized by the moderator before speaking.

(See Templates 2-5)

STEP 2: SPEAK WHEN RECOGNIZED

Once you have finished speaking, you can return to your seat. The light and screen will be automatically reset.

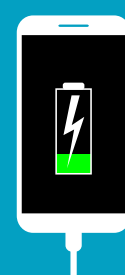

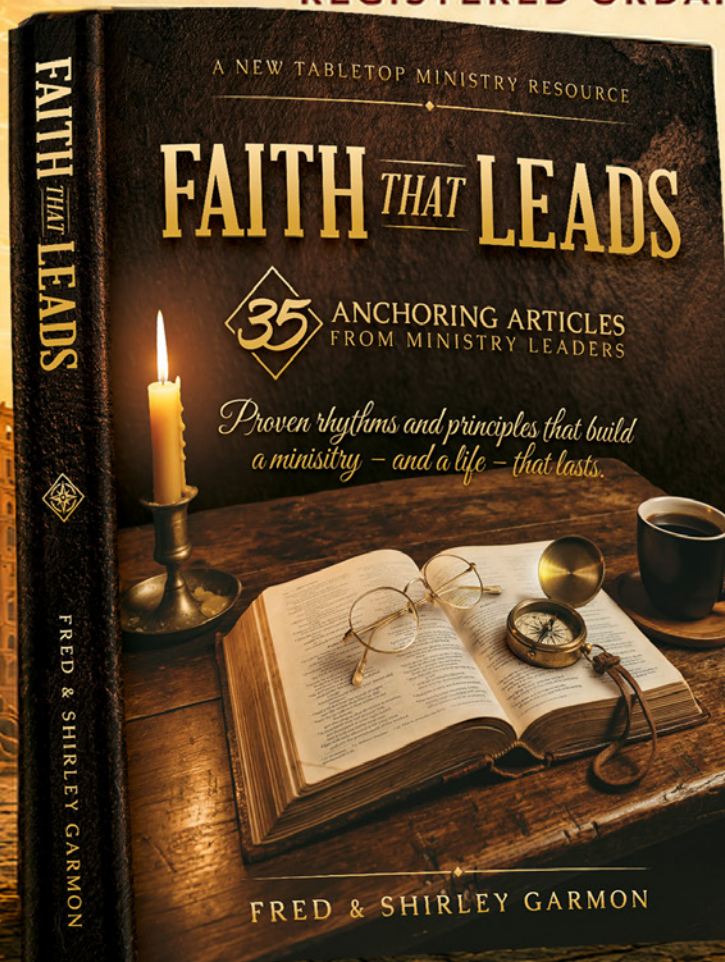

prevailed as the church united behind the rallying cry and the five areas of ministerial emphasis: We Go, We Disciple, We Preach, We Care, and We Pray.

As the vision took form, growing into strategy and on-field tactics, the Executive Committee adopted the “We Are” areas into their ministry portfolios, with each member’s divisions implementing their respective missions. In September of 2025, when we gathered for our Leadership meeting in Cleveland, the results of a year’s efforts were astounding. Leaders from around the world reported thousands of salvations, baptisms, and completed discipleship training. Youth events reported incredible moves of God, with over 100,000 students attending Winterfest Gatherings, youth camps, and rallies. The “Between Sundays” podcast launched and the download count soared as ministers and laity alike were blessed by this first-of-its-kind Church of God production. Our



benevolence ministries distributed millions of dollars in material assistance and provided disaster relief around the globe. These efforts were fueled by a renewed commitment to prayer as nearly half a million people engaged in our Global Prayer Meetings, and the Global Prayer Center opened at the Church of God International headquarters.

That was just the first year! This General Assembly will include an update to those figures and testimonies of God’s favor. We cannot overstate our gratitude for God’s anointing and goodness to the Church of God since our last Assembly gathering.

“We are the Church of God” has been a unifying catalyst for our tribe, and it is just getting started as we unite for ministry. Pastors, ministers, evangelists, and laypersons have seized onto the five

emphases and surged forward in pursuit of winning the lost. It is that groundswell of participation in ministry that we want to encourage and facilitate.

This week, we will be introducing more information, hearing more inspiring testimonies, and receiving more resources for completing the Great Commission. We will gather to discuss items that will position our church for more effective ministry in the days ahead. It is my prayer that those discussions and times of strategy will coincide with a divine encounter and that the Holy Spirit will be poured out once again on our Church. When the last convention center light is turned off, the last chair stacked, the last hotel departed from, and the last goodbye said, may the Church of God return to the harvest fields declaring, “We Are EMPOWERED!” ♦



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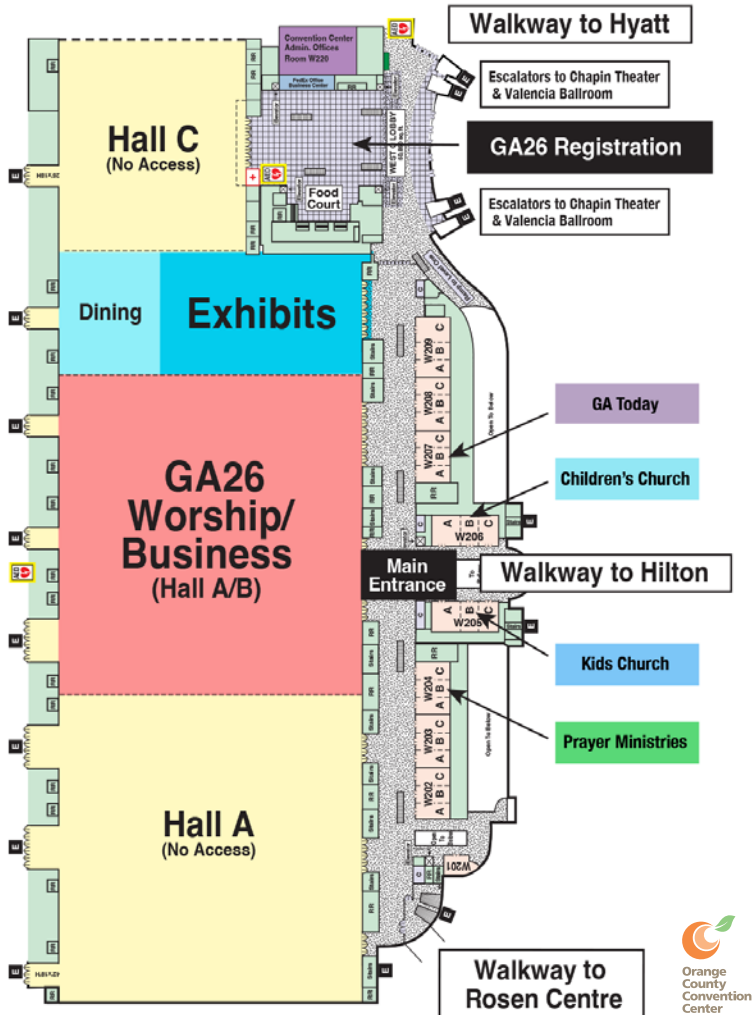
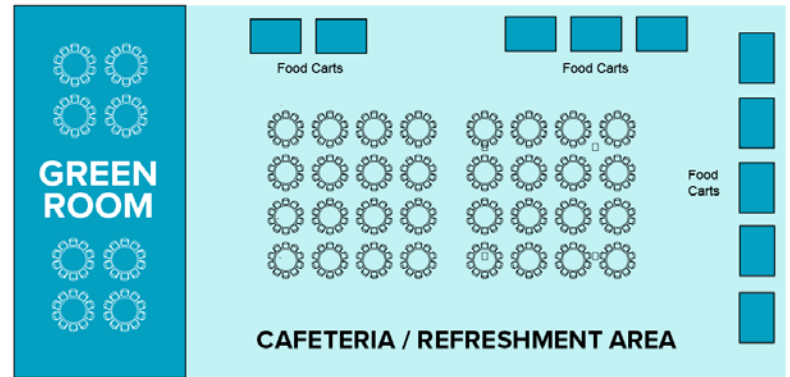

ten to complement the Church of God Heritage Exhibit by the same name in the exhibit hall.

“The pages of Scripture reveal much about music in the lives of God’s people,” observes Church of God Historian David G. Roebuck. “The Church of God has been especially blessed with talented and anointed songwriters and musicians. The words of Paul to the Colossians continue to inspire us today: ‘Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom, teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord’ (Colossians 3:16)”

Beginning with R.G. Spurling’s Christian Union in 1886, *Making a Joyful Noise* highlights the role of music in the life of the Church. The influence of the



Holiness Movement, the rise of convention songbooks, and the Church of God’s early efforts at publishing are related in the first article. Other articles convey the development of Tennessee Music and Printing Company and their publication of the *Church Hymnal*, the emergence of contemporary worship, and the influence of Church of God educational institutions. The final pages depict just a few of the countless people who have and continue to shape our musical legacy.

Making a Joyful Noise accompanies the Church of God Heritage Exhibit by the same name in the exhibit hall. Visitors will enjoy several special features including a display of LP record albums, listening stations, and a grand piano. Although some musicians are scheduled throughout the week, other times are available for pianists to stop by and play their favorite worship music. Additionally, the Dixon Pentecostal Research Center is continuing to record the stories of God’s work in the lives of Church of God members and ministers around the world. The “We Remember... We Tell” project provides an opportunity for delegates to reflect on God’s work in their lives (see article this issue).

Under the leadership of Chairman James E. Cossey, the Church of God Historical Commission and the Dixon Pentecostal Research Center produced the *Making a Joyful Noise* magazine and Heritage Exhibit especially for the 80th International General Assembly. Delegates are invited to stop by anytime the exhibit hall is open, where additional copies of the magazine will be available. ♦

Instrucciones Para los Delegados

1. Autoridad parlamentaria

- a. La Asamblea General Internacional se apega al manual de procedimiento parlamentario *Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised* (Las reglas del orden de Robert). La versión más reciente en inglés fue publicada en el 2020 y será utilizada en las sesiones de negocios del Concilio General Internacional y la Asamblea General Internacional.
- b. La Asamblea General Internacional también ha adoptado algunas normas que se ha impuesto sobre la manera en que se pueden llevar a cabo las sesiones de trabajo del Concilio General Internacional y de la Asamblea General Internacional. Por lo tanto, no podemos infringir sus propios estatutos. Cualquier moción para la suspensión de las reglas o para la inclusión de asuntos que no estén en la agenda antes de la finalización del trabajo del orden del día no será permisible, porque afectaría los estatutos y equivaldría a un intento de suspender los reglamentos, lo cual nunca es permisible. (Los estatutos solamente pueden ser enmendados bajo las circunstancias de notificación previa).
- c. Todas las sesiones de negocios se llevarán a cabo de manera ordenada.

2. Ubicación de los delegados

- a. Solo los obispos ordenados que estén debidamente inscritos podrán sentarse en las secciones identificadas para ellos. Deben portar sus credenciales y mostrarse visiblemente en todo momento.
- b. Los ministros ordenados, exhortadores y laicos podrán sentarse en cualquier área más allá de las designadas para los obispos ordenados del Concilio General Internacional.
- c. Las sesiones serán emitidas con retraso a través del internet. Todos los aparatos electrónicos deben permanecer en silencio durante los trabajos. **Prohibida la grabación de audio o video de las sesiones de negocios.**
- d. Todos los delegados deben estar debidamente inscritos y portar sus gafetes mostrando sus credenciales para asistir a las sesiones de negocios. Esto incluye ministros ordenados, exhortadores y laicos. El área de registro se encuentra en el lobby principal del Centro de Convenciones del Condado de Orange – Vestíbulo Oeste.

e. Ningún obispo ordenado se le permitirá votar a menos que sus credenciales sean visibles y se siente en el área de asientos designados. De haber perdido las credenciales, se pueden obtener nuevas en el Comité de Registro y Credenciales en el área de inscripción.

f. Cada miembro del Concilio General Internacional debe haber recibido el *Manual del Concilio General Internacional* en el momento de la inscripción. Este manual contiene materiales pertinentes para las reuniones del Concilio General Internacional y debe llevarse a todas las sesiones de negocios. La *Agenda* también está disponible electrónicamente en www.ga26.org.

g. De acuerdo con el Reglamento actual de la Asamblea General Internacional, «La Asamblea General Internacional está compuesta por todos los miembros y ministros de la Iglesia de Dios. Todos los miembros de 16 años en adelante y ministros de la Iglesia de Dios, presentes y registrados en la Asamblea General Internacional, constituirán su cuerpo con derecho al voto» (Minutas, S2. Reglamento de la Iglesia de Dios, Artículo VI, 1. Miembros, pág. 61).

3. Instrucciones con relación al protocolo durante las sesiones de negocios

a. Se recomienda la asistencia regular a todas las sesiones del Concilio General Internacional y a la sesión de negocios de la Asamblea General Internacional. El programa está impreso en el manual, en esta edición de *GA Today*, y en la parte posterior de la insignia o gafete del obispo ordenado, así como en www.ga26.org.

b. Durante las votaciones no se permitirá la salida ni la entrada a la sala. Los sargentos de armas tienen instrucciones para negar la entrada o salida durante la votación.

El moderador no responderá ninguna pregunta de los presentes cuando se esté llevando a cabo una votación. Cualquier problema, indíquese a un miembro del Comité de Sargentos de Armas.

4. Uso del formulario para presentar mociones

(Aplicable solo a los miembros inscritos del Concilio General)

Este formulario aparece en la parte posterior de los manuales y debe utilizarse para documentar por escrito las mociones o las enmiendas sometidas durante las sesiones de negocios del Concilio General Internacional o de la Asamblea General Internacional. Por favor, tenga el formulario completo y listo antes de presentar su moción/enmienda para no retrasar la sesión si el moderador lo solicita. Las mociones/enmiendas extensas

o complejas pueden enviarse por correo electrónico a gamotions@churchofgod.org. (Solo las mociones/enmiendas relacionadas con el orden del día en la agenda deben enviarse a este correo electrónico. Las mociones que no sean temas relacionados con la agenda deben presentarse por escrito en el mostrador del Comité de Mociones).

5. Límite del derecho a la palabra

- a. El secretario de registro contará el número de veces que cada persona tome la palabra.
- b. Un miembro no puede hablar más de diez minutos a menos que obtenga el consentimiento de la asamblea (Robert, pág. 39, 2020). Este permiso puede ser otorgado por decisión unánime, o por medio de una moción para extender los límites del debate, que requiere un voto de dos tercios (2/3) sin debate (Robert, págs. 179-187). Denise Watkins tomará el tiempo y el secretario general indicará “Tiempo” cuando el plazo haya expirado.
- c. Ningún miembro podrá retomar la palabra sobre el mismo asunto por segunda vez en el mismo día, mientras que otra persona esté esperando por su turno para hacer uso de la palabra. Debido a que el moderador no siempre puede saber cuántas veces se habla, dependerá de que el secretario lo mantenga informado.

6. La Agenda

- a. La *agenda* enviada por correo electrónico, puesta a disposición al menos treinta días antes de la apertura del Concilio General Internacional, es la «agenda oficial, que ha de considerarse en las sesiones de negocios del Concilio General Internacional» (Minutas, pág. 71, S4. Concilio General Internacional, III. Agenda del Concilio General Internacional). No es necesaria una moción para aprobar o recibir la agenda, ya que, según nuestro reglamento, ya ha sido aprobada. La *agenda* también está disponible electrónicamente en www.ga26.info.
- b. El *Reglamento* exige que «cualquier asunto nuevo será presentado al presidente del comité de mociones. Este comité lo recibirá, clasificará, aclarará, eliminará cualquier duplicación e incluirá al final de la agenda impresa» (Minutas, pág. 63, S2. Reglamento, Artículo 6, 2. Concilio General Internacional, Agenda, párrafo 4).

Nota: Cualquier asunto nuevo para la consideración del Concilio General Internacional de 2026 debe ser presentado en un formato legible (impreso o digital) a más tardar a las 2:00 p. m. del segundo día del Concilio General Internacional (A78, 2022).

c. Tenga en cuenta que el material actual de las *Minutas* se encuentra en las páginas del lado izquierdo (páginas pares) y las nuevas mociones están en las páginas del lado derecho (páginas nones).

7. Función de los parlamentarios

9. Instrucciones de votación

electrónica (solo para el Concilio General)

a. Las votaciones para todos los cargos se realizará mediante un sistema de teclado inalámbrico. Los miembros no compartirán dispositivos. Los aparatos estarán disponibles después de la llamada al orden del día por parte del moderador. Todos los teclados serán desinfectados una vez que se devuelvan.

1. Antes de cada sesión, todos los ministros deben validar por sí solos su información. Siguiendo las instrucciones del moderador, ingrese los cinco dígitos de su credencial ministerial personal y verifique que esté correcto. Si no está correcto, presione la tecla "delete" y vuelva a ingresarlo. Si está correcto, presione la tecla "SEND". El teclado mostrará "sending" y "received." Si desea abstenerse, simplemente no vote. No será necesario reingresar su número otra vez en la misma sesión.

2. Si su teclado no funciona correctamente, devuélvalo al mostrador para que lo reemplacen, o levante la mano y un miembro del Comité de escrutinio le ayudará.

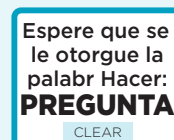
